But this book is all about character development, the hero not only embarking on an exciting adventure, but also exhibiting different skills that are just as important.

Although I enjoyed the plot of this novel—it's unpredictable with plenty of suspense—I felt the book's biggest strength is its message. And that message is—no matter what anybody says and no matter what problems you have, anybody can be a hero. I like that a lot and I felt many children, particularly boys struggling in school, will relate to this message and find strength in it.

Don't get me wrong, it's not all message! There are plenty of thrills and spills too—and a little underlying humour which children always enjoy. All in all, with its accessible vocabulary, short chapters and vibrant speech, it's bound to be a winner with most middle graders. 



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
